

# 윗집 사람

#### **GRAMMAR FOCUS**

## Verb + -나 보다

With this form, you indicate that the sentence is a guess, and it's something you think to be true. You should have some direct evidence, reason, or observation that supports your guess when using this form.

- 지금 밥을 먹나 보다. It seems like they're eating now.
- 아...윗집 사람이 들어왔**나 보다.** Oh...it **seems like** the upstairs neighbor is back.

### Noun + -답게

This form emphasizes appropriate or fitting behavior in accordance with the characteristics or nature of a person or thing. It means 'as is fitting for,' 'in a manner befitting of' or 'being NOUN,' or simply 'NOUN-like.'

- 한국 사람답게 행동해.
  Act like you're Korean.
- 나무로 지어진 아파트답게 생각보다 층간소음이 커요. It's noisier than I expected, being made of wood and all.

## Adjective + -(으)ㄴ 듯하다

This form is used to make a guess about something or someone based on their appearance. The guess is based on something observable. It means "appears to (be)," or "seems like." While they are similar, it is less casual than the ~나 보다 form mentioned above. For past tense verbs use ~(으)ㄴ 듯하다. For future tense verbs use ~(으)ㄹ 듯하다.

#### Verb + -는 듯하다

- 그 사람은 내일 이사를 가는 듯해요. It seems like they're moving out tomorrow.
- 그 사람의 표정을 보니 어젯밤의 일을 알고 있는 듯했어요. From the look on her face, she **seemed to be** aware of what had happened last night.
